**July 14 – 15th Sunday of Ordinary Time (Year B)**

**XV Domenica Del Tempo Ordinario (Anno B)**

Per mezzo dei suoi messaggeri, Dio ha preparato l'umanità, nel corso di una lunga storia, alla venuta di suo Figlio e alla rivelazione della salvezza da lui portata. Partendo dal popolo di Israele, il suo amore redentore doveva estendersi a tutti gli uomini. È il motivo per cui Gesù ha chiamato i Dodici a formare il nucleo del popolo definitivo di Dio e li ha fatti suoi collaboratori. Sono stati incaricati di vincere il potere del male, di guarire e di salvare gli uomini che avessero creduto al loro messaggio. Solo una piccola parte del popolo di Israele ha creduto in Gesù e in quelli che egli ha mandato. Dopo la sua risurrezione, Gesù ha di nuovo mandato i suoi discepoli e accresciuto la loro missione e i loro poteri. Da allora gli inviati di Dio si recano presso tutti i popoli per offrire agli uomini il perdono di Dio e la vita nuova. Ma non vi è che una piccola parte dell'umanità che ha sentito l'offerta divina e ha trovato la fede nell'amore di Dio e nella sua salvezza. Oggi che sono state smascherate le ideologie moderne del razionalismo e del nazionalismo, del fascismo e del socialismo, che si sono rivelate false dottrine di salvezza, si è operata una nuova apertura per il Vangelo presso molti popoli e molti uomini. E noi cristiani siamo tenuti, in modo nuovo, a portare la nostra testimonianza al nostro prossimo: per mezzo della nostra preghiera e del nostro impegno personale. Da questa testimonianza dipende non solo l'avvenire dell'umanità, ma anche quello della comunità ecclesiale ed il destino di ogni cristiano.

Sunday's Gospel places the Twelve in the line of the authentic prophetic tradition in that they are ordinary people sent out with the authority of Jesus to carry on the preaching, liberating, and healing role that has been his alone up till now.

The Twelve, of course, are the "pillars" upon which the later Church will be built. Their mission here foreshadows that of the Church, establishing something essential for its life: that it is always a community on mission, entrusted with the supreme treasure of the Gospel and the healing ministry carried out in the Sacraments.

How it is to imitate these first missionaries in the "lightness" of its travel is far more of a problem, granted the massive institutional plant and wealth that the Church has acquired in the course of the centuries. There are no facile solutions to this – save perhaps the otherwise traumatic experience of persecution. But the Gospel reminds the Church that the effectiveness of its prophetic role – its critique of prevailing cultural assumptions and practice – will largely be in proportion to the "lightness" with which it travels, the trust in the goodness (hospitality) of ordinary people and the lack of self-seeking it presents to the world. This is perhaps all the more necessary at a time when the Church's credibility has been so seriously eroded by the sexual abuse crisis.
